Registration Deadline for FEMA, SBA Assistance Extended to Nov. 9

Homeowners and renters with uninsured or underinsured damage to their property from Aug. 8 wildfires on Maui now have until **Thursday, Nov. 9**, to apply for federal disaster assistance. Survivors have another 30 days to register for FEMA assistance and apply for a physical disaster loan from the U.S. Small Business Administration. Businesses with economic losses can apply for an SBA Economic Injury Disaster Loan (EIDL) until May 10,2024

Survivors are encouraged to file insurance claims for damage to their homes, personal property and vehicles before they apply for FEMA assistance, which is available to eligible individuals and households.
